## Course Name and Objective

Paramedic Lecture/Lab I 310 hours

This course will prepare the prospective student to fulfill the requirements of the highest level of Pre-hospital Provider riding an *Advanced Life Support* transport and non-transport unit or assist with patient care in an Emergency Room setting. Upon successful completion of the program, of which this course is included, the student will receive a diploma.

**\*\*Note:** This is a clock hour program only.

## Course Description

This residential course includes online, classroom and lab activities. This course starts the Paramedic program and ends at the Mid-Term. This course includes an introduction into the program, Anatomy and Physiology, Respiratory and Cardiac Emergencies and Care, Pharmacology, and Medication Administration. This course also includes 4 hours of mandatory HIV/AIDS Awareness training.

## Prerequisite

Students seeking admission to this course have to complete the Emergency Medical Technician program prior to the start of this class. Students can start this course but will not be allowed to take the course Final Exam ("Midterm Exam") unless they have successfully obtained their **Florida** EMT License. Additionally, students must maintain certification in *BLS for the Healthcare Provider* by the American Heart Association or equivalent. Students must also meet all admission requirements as set forth in the Program Catalog.

Paramedic Lecture/Lab II 368 hours

This course will prepare the prospective student to fulfill the requirements of the highest level of Pre-hospital Provider riding an *Advanced Life Support* transport and non-transport unit or assist with patient care in an Emergency Room setting. Upon successful completion of the program, of which this course is included, the student will receive a diploma.

## Course Description

This residential course includes online, classroom and lab activities. This course starts at the conclusion of PM100 when the student successfully passes the "Mid Term" exam. This course includes trauma care, Obstetrics, Pediatric and geriatric care. This course also covers Hazardous Materials, the National Incident Management System and a comprehensive review of the program.

## Prerequisite

Students must successfully complete PM100 prior to starting this class. This class cannot be attended while completing PM100. Additionally, students must maintain certification in *BLS for the Healthcare Provider* by the American Heart Association or equivalent. Students must also meet all admission requirements as set forth in the Program Catalog.

Field Externship 350 hours

This course will prepare the prospective student to fulfill the requirements of the highest level of Pre-hospital Provider riding an *Advanced Life Support* transport and non-transport unit or assist with patient care in an Emergency Room setting. Upon successful completion of the program, of which this course is included, the student will receive a diploma.

**\*\*Note:** This is a clock hour program only.

## Course Description

The field externship hours are performed on an Advance Life Support unit. 280 hours must be completed on an Advanced Life Support transport unit, while 70 hours can be performed on a non-transport Advance Life Support unit. These hours provide the student the opportunity to demonstrate skills and abilities in the emergency setting of an Ambulance or Rescue Unit.

## Course Name and Description

Hospital Externship 72 hours

This course will prepare the prospective student to fulfill the requirements of the highest level of Pre-hospital Provider riding an *Advanced Life Support* transport and non-transport unit or assist with patient care in an Emergency Room setting. Upon successful completion of the program, of which this course is included, the student will receive a diploma.

**\*\*Note:** This is a clock hour program only.

## Course Objective

This off-site clinical externship based course is intended for students seeking an entry-level position in the medial field. This course includes 72 hours of clinical activities at a near by hospital during the last 4-6 months of the Paramedic Program. This class includes, but is not limited to, many of the following skill aspects of emergency and basic care: cardiac and respiratory emergencies, trauma, special populations, CPR and first aid, and effective communication between healthcare workers, patients, and family members. Students will be able to recognize, treat and manage patient care in regards to: cardiac and respiratory emergencies, trauma, special populations, CPR and first aid, obstetrics, pediatrics, and psychiatric emergencies. This course is strictly hands on clinical skills at the hospital. This course will provide the student with "real life" practice to help ensure skill competency prior to program completion.

## Prerequisite

Students seeking admission to this course have to complete the Emergency Medical Technician program prior to the start of this class. Students can start this course but will not be granted successful completion if they have not obtained their Florida EMT license prior to the start of PM101. This course will be completed congruently with PM100, PM101, and PM102. Additionally, students must maintain certification in *BLS for the Healthcare Provider* by the American Heart Association or equivalent. Students must also meet all admission requirements as set forth in the Program Catalog.
